Frosh beanies and other related paraphenalia disappeared from frosh week this year. In a small way this was indicative of the radical change this campus has under gone during the last few years.





Comment



I recently sifted through several term papers written by students who participated in our experimental class. These students had one common interest — that the quality of our environment is rapidly deteriorating.

The options presented by such classes are of great potential. Obviously they enliven student interest by offering opportunities for study which are not on the college calendar. Furthermore, it channels interest by providing a structure in which others of like mind may share their interest.

This particular class however, deserves some comment. It dealt with a very real and directly observable problem — pollution of our environment.

Two options face such classes. They may constitute themselves into an essentially action-orientated group or they may constitute themselves into an essentially academic type of study group. If the former is the case, then there is little potential for such classes, other than their being a means for students to follow their particular esoteric interests.


The academic side of this type of class (where the two options I noted are available) will probably predominate while the central goal of taking a course is to get a credit.

Students invest a great deal of time and money and sometimes effort in getting their degrees. It is not surprising then, that the university has such a co-optive influence over action-orientated groups. Action is not discouraged but the capacity for control is definitely a factor of no small significance.


A question to be answered by many students who are orientated toward such classes is whether or not an action-orientated group can function within the constaints presented by the university structure.

Experience has proven that any group which seeks to do more than study a particular problem must draw its strength from sharing a common goal or goals which predominate all other goals that individuals of the group may have. Such a situation is not likely when individual students face the conflict of spending time getting marks or spending time putting studies into action.


The instances of physical and social pollution on these pages underline the urgency of the conflict.





the lead? I had problems getting started.




And they've done the same thing to Greg Neumann too. I don't see how they claim there's nothing political about this

We can do parodies of Students' Council or Hicks. Or what about tuition going up so that only upper class kids can come to university. We need some sports stories too.




Not bad for a re-building year. We should be all set for next year, with a little help from our friends.



An absence of facilities on campus again did not stop the swimming team from coming up with some fine individual efforts. Lack of depth (people) however, kept the team as






a whole from equalling the efforts of a few championship performances.

Contrasting those teams were ones that ran into familiar obstacles. The men's volley-






Size eventually overcame the "democratic" approach and the student body asked the administration to take over the sports program. That is the situation that has existed for the 30-40 years.

Now the situation has almost come full circle. As of March 1971, there exists the Dalhousie Sports and Physical Recreation Council. Representation on this committee is 50% students. The main components of this council come from the Physical Education faculty and the five standing committees involved in athletics at Dal.

The exact composition of the Council is as follows:

A. Members appointed by the President

- 2 members, one female and one male nominated by the Student's Council.
- 1 member nominated by the Student Services Committee.
- 1 member nominated by the Alumni association.
- 1 member from faculty or administrative staff.

B. Members appointed by the 5 Standing Committees

- 5 members who are from the executive offices of each committee (this is where the staff of the physical education department will have most, if not all, the positions).
- 5 members who are students, each elected by one of the Standing Committees.
- the 5 Standing Committees are as follows

Men's Athletic Committee Women's Athletic Committee Men's Intramural Committee Women's Intramural Committee Physical Recreation Committee


 Director of the School of Physical Education. (All the preceding members have voting priviledges, except the Director of the School of Physical Education)

Too much significance can not be accorded the Council. Students, through their elected members, will have a say on such policies as recruiting, scholarships and even the very principle of competitive athletics. Because the athletic budget must be accepted by the Council, the heart of the athletic program rests with the members.


What has been discussed is mainly concerned with varsity athletics. The Council is not — and should not be — concerned only with varsity athletics. Financial and time allowances that will be made in intramural and carry-over sports (sports that can be played in later life as well) are in the hands of the Council.


The existance of the Council does not guarantee or necessitate any changes. The fact a structure has been set up is at present, the most important aspect. How the sports and recreation program at Dal will evolve is a question left for the future.


