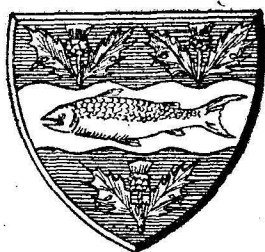


NOVA SCOTIA
