- JOHN LAIRD. Professor of Logic and Metaphysics (since 1913) Queen's University of Belfast. Professor of Philosophy (1912-13) Dalhousie University. Author of *Problems of the Self, Studies in Realism*, etc.
- SIR ROBERT FALCONER, K.C.M.G. President of the University of Toronto. Principal (1904-1907) of the Presbyterian Theological College, Halifax. Author of many articles on educational subjects in British and American Encyclopaedias and Reviews.
- ARTHUR HUGH URQUHART COLQUHOUN. Deputy Minister of Education, Ontario. Secretary of Royal Commission on Universities, 1905. Author of *Fathers of Confederation*, and of many magazine articles on subjects of Canadian history.

- Humphrey Mellish. Justice of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia. President (1912-13) of the Nova Scotia Barristers' Society.
- JOHN SKIRVING EWART, K. C. Confined his legal practice for many years to the Supreme Court and the Privy Council. Chief Canadian Counsel in North Atlantic Fisheries Arbitration at the Hague, 1910. A prolific writer of books and articles on legal subjects and on questions of Canadian constitution and development.
- Warwick F. Chipman, K. C. Professor in the Faculty of Law, McGill University. Has published many articles on literary, legal, and constitutional subjects. Formerly a frequent contributor to *The University Magazine*.
- BENJAMIN RUSSELL. Justice of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia. M. P. for Halifax in Federal House, 1896. Professor of Contracts, Commercial Law and Equity, Dalhousie University, 1884-1921. Mr. Justice Russell's article on Parkman in this issue of *The Dalhousie Review* was read last month as an address to the Nova Scotia Historical Society.
- BEATRICE M. HAY SHAW. Journalist and Novelist. From 1901 until 1911 Mrs. Shaw was much occupied in the editorial department of such English papers as *The Daily Chronicle*, *The Daily Express*, and *The Standard*, for which she wrote many articles on educational subjects. Staff correspondent overseas for Toronto *Mail and Empire* after August 1914.
