With Maru and Sarath Sasidharan, whom he also regarded as a son, he explored other sides of himself and them.

As husband to Linda Macdonald, he was kind, loving, and supportive. They were partners in everything. He was her hero. Jim leaves behind his sisters, niece Gena, nephew Jimmy, his daughters, his sons through marriage and friendship, his brother- and sister-in-law Gary Macdonald and Mary Costa, and cousins including Eric Barker and Orlin Barker. He leaves his family in the Department of Leadership and Organizations at Dalhousie and his research companions in Medicine and Management worldwide. He leaves his students and those he mentored.
