HERBERT LESLIE STEWART

1882-1953

It is with profound regret that The Dalhousie Review records the death in Halifax on September 19, 1953, of Herbert Leslie Stewart, M.A., Ph.D., F.R.S.C. Dr. Stewart, Founder and for many years Editor of The Review, was a well-known contributor to this and to many other publications. A man of great scholarship, perceptive observation, and skilled literary craftsmanship, he was widely known and respected as an author and radio commentator.

At Dalhousie University, where he taught for so many years, as George Munro Professor of Philosophy, he will be greatly missed, but he will also be missed by hundreds of former students, and by many who knew him only through his writings and broadcasts.
