## 1. Proposed Honours Programme in Computing Science

It was noted that the Financial Planning Committee has no reservations about the academic quality of the programme, but felt that approval should be deferred until the major programme had been approved by M.P.H.E.C. A letter was received from the President indicating that it was his understanding that M.P.H.E.C. has now approved in principle the proposed major programme in computing science.

It was moved and seconded (Jones/Tonks) that
the proposed Honours Programme in Computing Science be approved, but that implementation of the programme require a further decision of Senate, after advice has been received from the appropriate Senate planning committees.

The motion was carried.
It was moved and seconded (Jones/Szerb) that
discussion be initiated with appropriate universities in the Halifax area regarding the co-operative implementation of a programme in Computing Science. Areas of cooperation might include: (1) capital costs, (2) new and/or joint faculty and staff positions, (3) establishment of common classes, (4) the need for transfer credits for classes and/or the establishment of a joint degree programme. Results of these deliberations are to be considered by Senate at the time any decisions to be taken to implement the Honours Programme in Computing Science.

The motion was carried.
