The President's Message



In my time at Dalhousie I have seen the University increase at least several fold in its student body, its buildings, its endowments, its operating costs and its academic undertakings, and I think we have done all this without sacrificing our good name for scholastic excellence.

We have by no means attained our goal. We have outlined a programme for the next five years that will require all the money that the University is likely to obtain from even a successful campaign. In the remoter future, Dalhousie should have "the power to expand with the growth and improvement of our society". Our past achievements encourage us to go forward with confidence that the best is yet to be.

The successive issues of *Pharos* will help to remind my wife and me of the students whom it has been our privilege to know here, and it will serve the same purpose for students themselves as they wish to recall their class-mates. We shall regard each volume as a pictorial reminder of days that had their full share of interesting problems, but that were on the whole very happy indeed, and I trust also creative in the life of Dalhousie.

I bid farewell to my last graduating class in the University with a prayer that its members will recall with pleasure their life in college, and will discover for themselves as the years go on the things that make life rich and satisfying. For my successor I bespeak the same cordial co-operation that you have given me.



Dedication

Dr. Alexander E. Kerr

President, 1945 - 1963

We, the editors, proudly dedicate *Pharos* '63 to Dr. Alexander E. Kerr, in this his year of retirement.

Dr. Kerr was born in Louisbourg, N.S., and obtained his early education in the schools of that area. During the latter part of World War I, he enlisted in, and served overseas with the Royal Air Force. Upon his return, he entered Dalhousie and obtained his Bachelor of Arts and, subsequently, his degree in theology from Pine Hill. After being ordained in 1921, Dr. Kerr attended Union Seminary in New York, where he received his Bachelor of Divinity (*magna cum laude*).

From that time, up until 1939, Dr. Kerr served the Church in Sydney, Montreal, Vancouver, and Winnipeg, leaving there to serve six years as principal and professor of systematic theology at Pine Hill Divinity Hall. In 1945, Dr. Kerr was invited to become president of Dalhousie and was installed on November 13 of that year.

Under Dr. Kerr's leadership, Dalhousie has made tremendous strides forward. The enrollment has increased from approximately twelve hundred to well over twenty-five hundred, with three hundred persons attending part-time for post-graduate work. A number of new faculties of Health Professions, and the Institute of Oceanography on the shores of Bedford Basin; research grants have grown from almost nothing to over \$600,000 a year. New buildings can be seen on campus; the Arts and Administration Building was opened in 1951, the Sir James Dunn Science Building in 1960, the New Men's Residence in 1961, and an addition to Shirreff Hall in 1963. In addition, extensive plans have been made by Dr. Kerr and the Deans for the development of the university over the next five years, involving a campaign to raise over \$16,000,000.

Dr. Kerr has received six honorary degrees. The one he covets most is the Doctor of Divinity received in 1951 at the five-hundredth anniversary of the founding of Glasgow University.

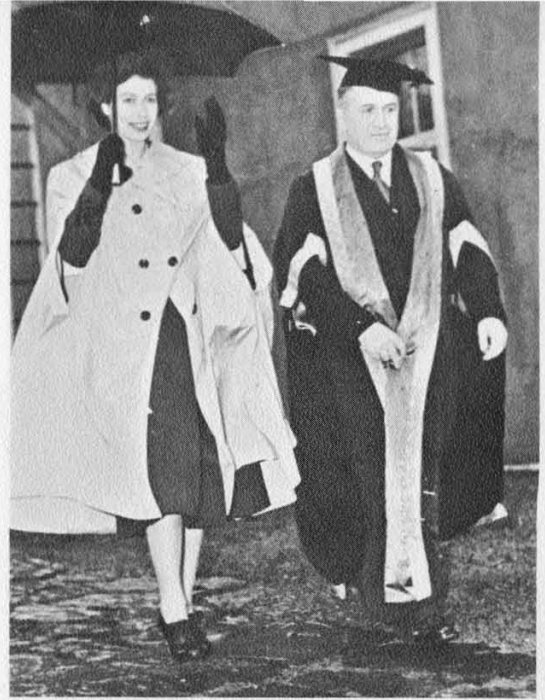
Dr. Kerr has entertained many distinguished visitors to Dalhousie, among whom are the Earl and Countess of Dalhousie, Viscount Alexander, Lady Dunn, Sir Edward Appleton, Lady Bambridge (daughter of Rudyard Kipling) and Princess Elizabeth on her Royal Tour prior to her coronation.

Dr. and Mrs. Kerr have four children all of whom are graduates of Dalhousie. Students and student affairs have long been of interest to both Dr. and Mrs. Kerr. Mrs. Kerr has been a gracious hostess at numerous student receptions.

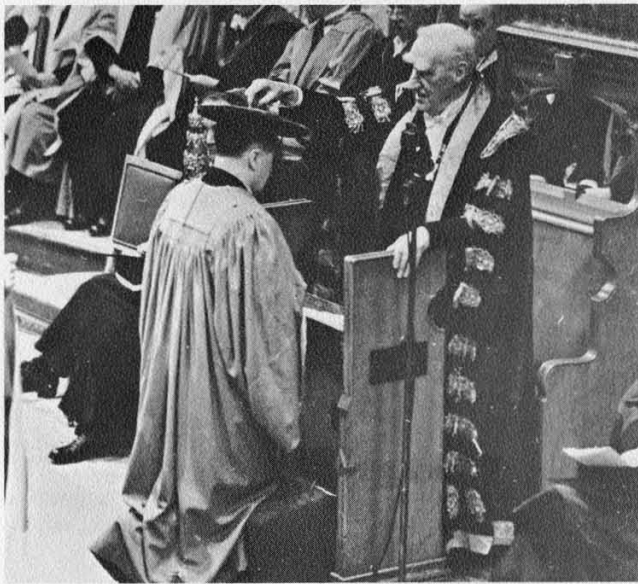
During his term of office, Dr. Kerr has, without a doubt, succeeded in laying a strong foundation for the Dalhousie of the future.

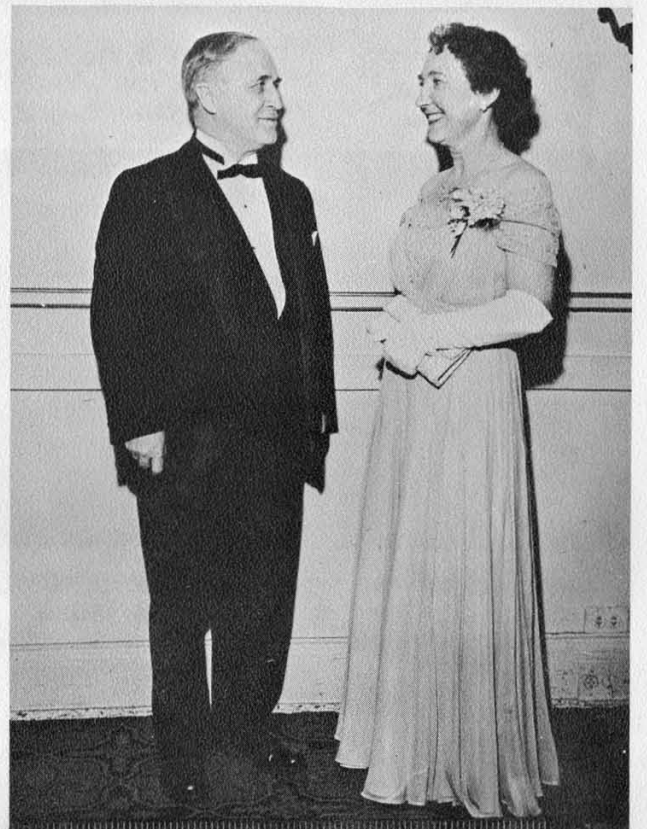

Tribute To President Puxley



President Puxley's resignation, to become the first Director of the Canadian Institute of Ecumenical Affairs, will bring a keen sense of personal regret to many people at Dalhousie and not least to the large number of students with whom he has come into such happy relationship during the nine years of his Presidency of King's.

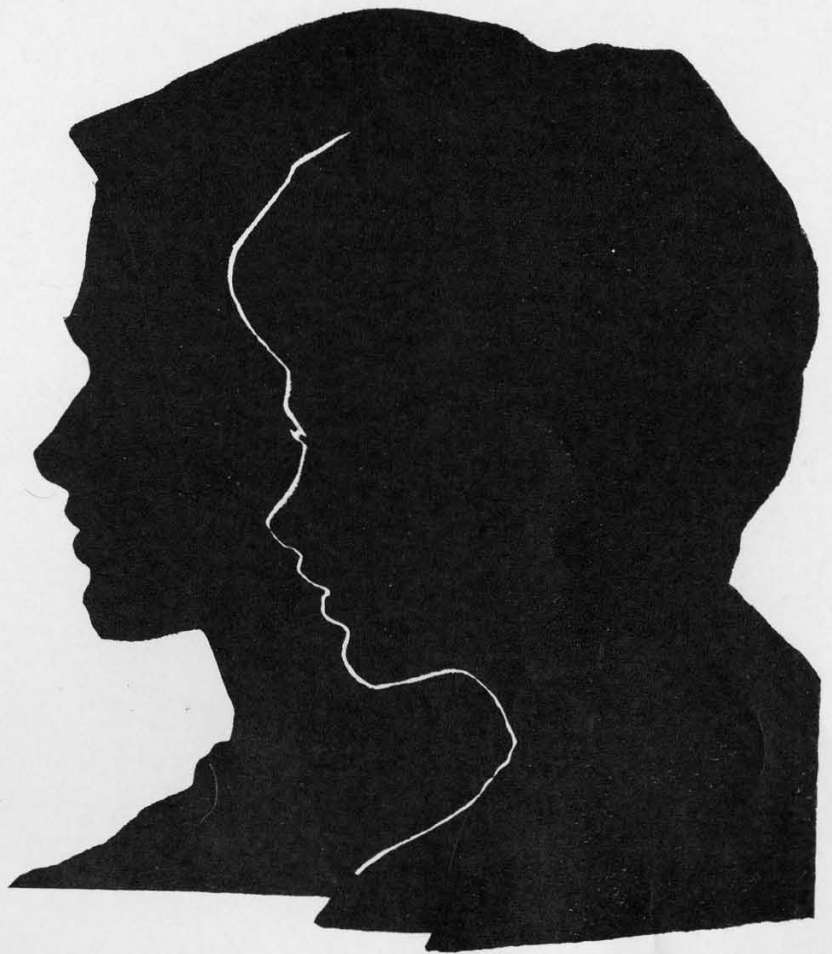
From the first he showed himself to be the most approachable of men, with unflinching courtesy to all, prodigally generous of his time, placing himself at the disposal of those who sought his counsel and never declining to involve himself personally in their problems. He has been notably interested in all forms of student activity and, while not unappreciative of its more solemn endeavours, has entered with a rare enthusiasm into the games and contests, and all the fun and frolic of collegiate life. Yet we have never been allowed to forget that behind the gaiety and ready sympathy there lay disturbingly challenging convictions, an intense devotional life, and an anxious concern for our moral and spiritual welfare.

They have been lively and exciting years, full of activity and of constructive change, culminating in the expansion programme and the transformation of the campus by the erection of the new buildings which will remain a permanent monument to his energy and vision. A splendidly daring imagination was shown in the conception of an Institute of Parapsychology, of a Latin-American Institute, and of a University Christian Council. His impact on the community has attracted to the University the gifts and special skills of a number of distinguished persons. Few have done more, and in so short a space of time, to bring the University out of the ivory tower and to bring the world into the University.

No tribute to President Puxley's accomplishments on the campus would be complete without an appreciation of the important contribution of Mrs. Puxley. Her generous hospitality, always thoughtfully contrived with an unerring eye to the congeniality and mutual enjoyment of her guests, her clear and exceptionally well-informed mind, her penetrating insight into character, have all played a significant part in that less formal side of our education which we remember with particular gratitude.

To President and Mrs. Puxley we extend our warmest thanks for their many kindnesses and our most sincere good wishes for their continued happiness and success in their new sphere of activity.

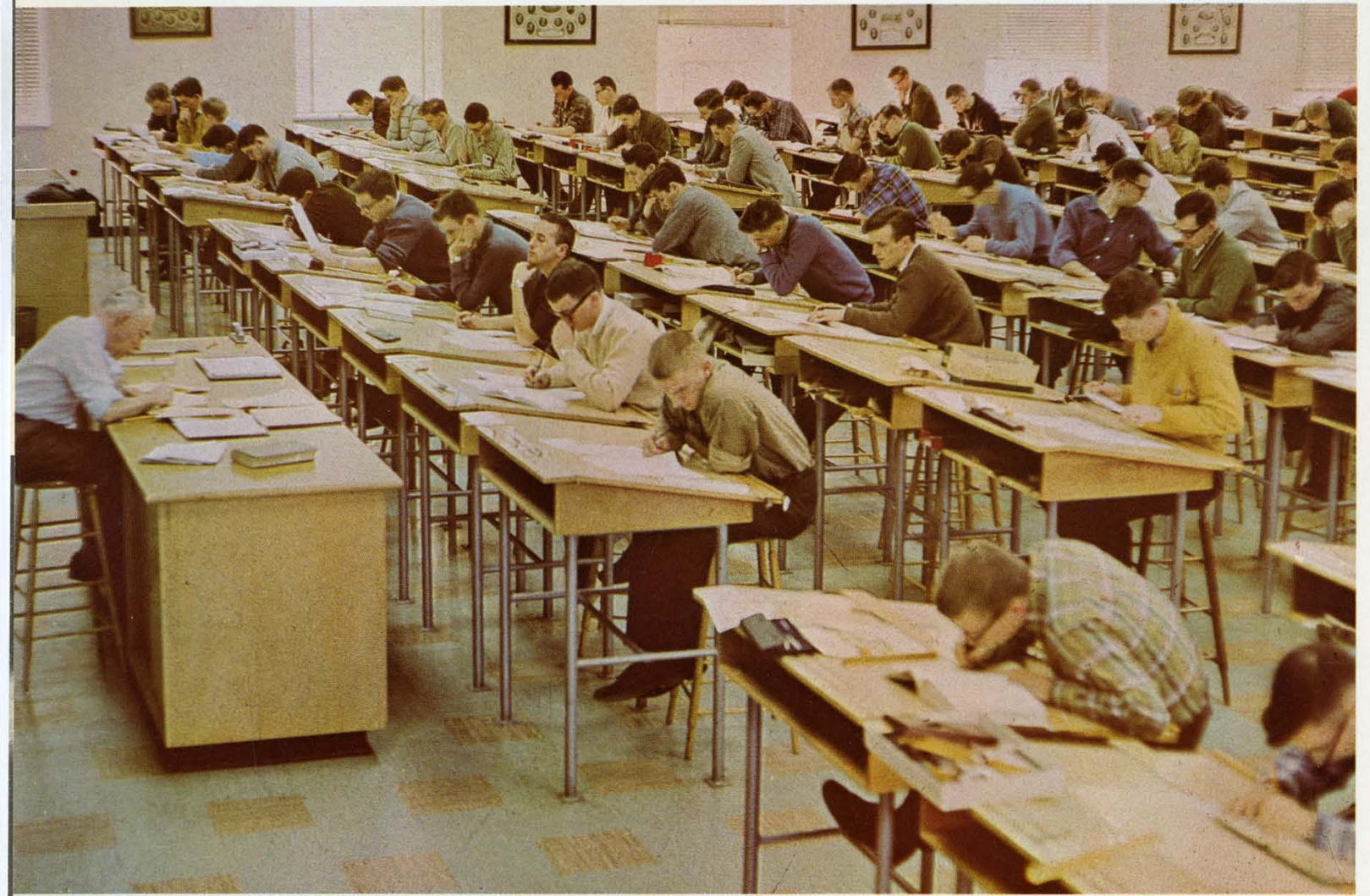

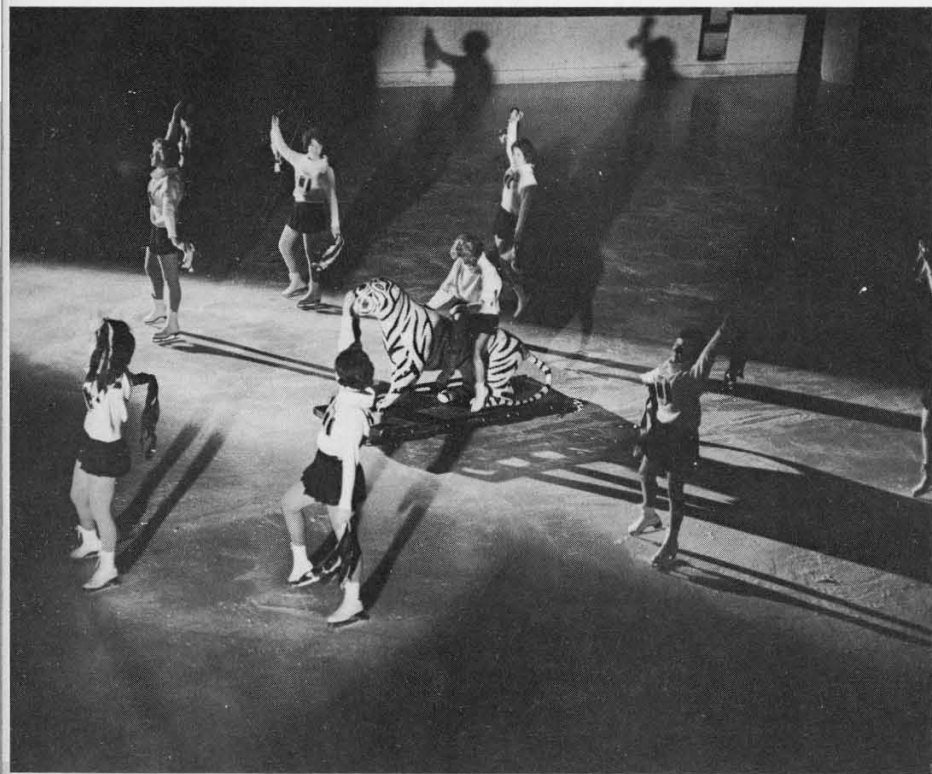

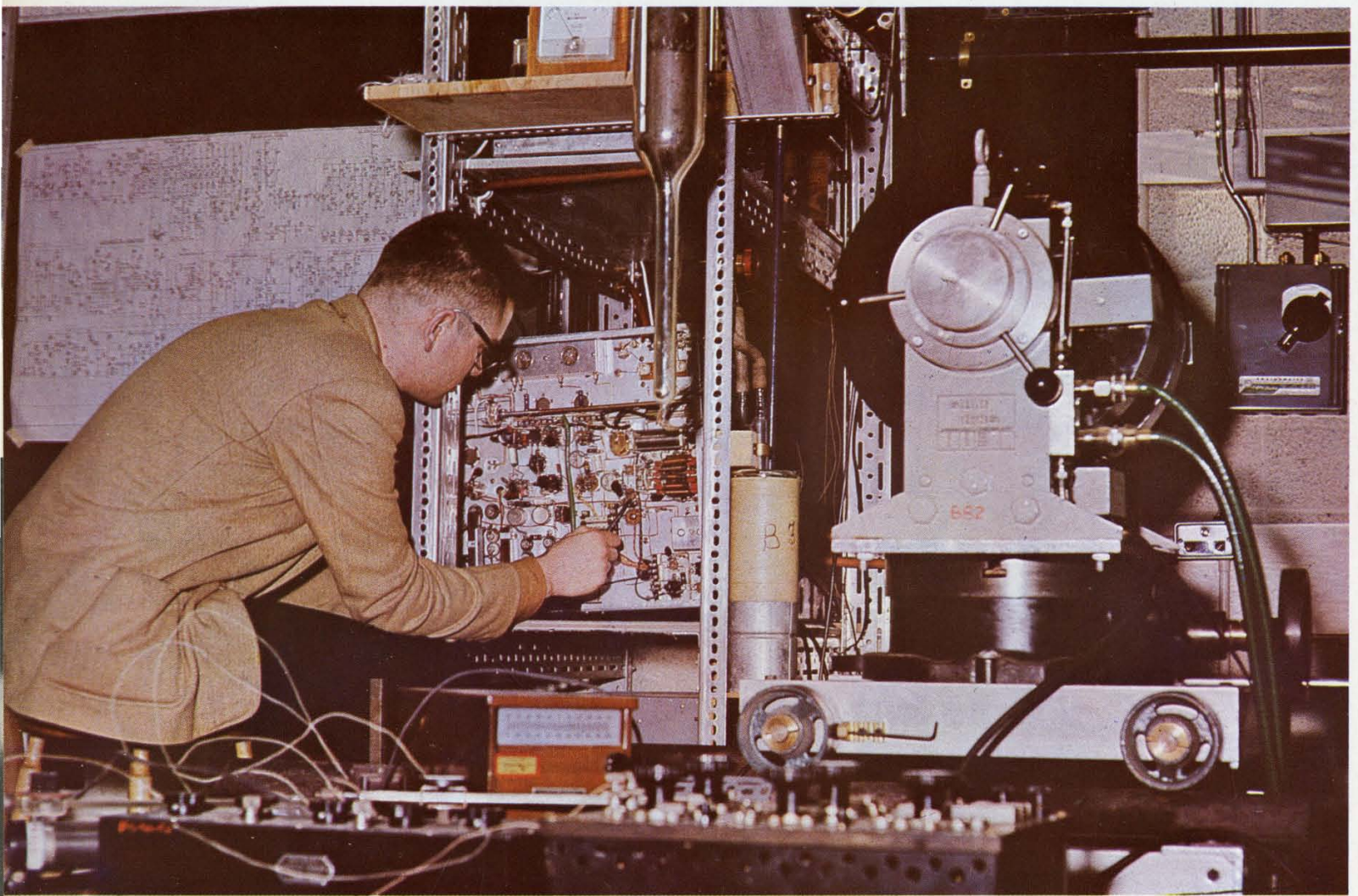

THE ROMANCE OF THE FIRST LIGHTHOUSE

(From "The Treasury of Modern Marvels")

. . . It was a tragedy that led to the building of the first lighthouse. Sostratus, a young architect, desired to marry a lovely Athenian maiden and when the time for the wedding had arrived the girl, together with her parents, set out to cross the piece of water separating Greece from Egypt. As they approached Egypt the sea, which up to then had been quite calm, became very rough, and the pitch darkness of the night prevented them from seeing ahead; neither could those on land, who heard their cries of distress, help them in any way. When the dawn came, Sostratus and his relatives found that his bride and all who had accompanied her had been drowned, for the ship had struck against some terrible rocks and been broken to pieces. Sostratus was so overcome with grief that he gave up doing his work and passed his time in sighing and weeping over the event.

. . . Some months later Dinocrates, his beloved friend and master, suggested to him a way by which he could give concrete expression to his sorrow and at the same time prevent a shipwreck occurring a second time. The idea conceived by Dinocrates was to build a tall white tower on the island of Pharos from the top of which flames would show to those on the sea the rocks and dangerous shoals near the coast. So Sostratus, very pleased with this suggestion, set to work to plan not only a beacon for boats but also a monument worthy of his Athenian love. The reigning Ptolemy, for Alexander the Great was now dead, took an interest in the undertaking and told Sostratus not to allow the cost to deter him from making it as beautiful as possible.

The site chosen was at the eastern end of the Isle of Pharos by the entrance to the harbour. According to old

records the structure was four hundred feet high and consisted of several storeys, each one narrower than the preceding one, the higher ones having windows looking towards the sea, out of which large flames and torches lit up the surrounding parts during the night. An iron basket, fixed in a specially shaped hollow on the top storey was used for the fire, the men who attended to the fire thus becoming the first lighthouse keepers. The shape of the building was square, and the material used was pure white stone. That the best materials and workmanship were employed is proved by its enormous cost of eight hundred talents, that is, about £150,400 in English money.

. . . . It remained as a guide to sailors for close on fifteen hundred years and then, in the fourteenth century, it was wiped out by an earthquake. Owing to its great usefulness the idea was copied by other nations, and in due course most treacherous coasts were made safer for ships by the erection of these illuminated towers.

Instead of being called a tower, the name of "pharos", from the island on which it stood, was given to it, and this became the ordinary Greek term for a lighthouse. In French the word in use is "phare", while the two forms of "phare" and "pharos" are current in English to-day, so that in this way the work of the builder of the first lighthouse, considered as one of the great wonders of olden times, is kept alive in our modern world. If you have been to Dover Castle you will have seen the ancient tower there, dating from Roman times, and used in olden days as a lighthouse. It is known to-day as the "pharos", and thus reminds us of the love of Sostratus, and of the first lighthouse, away at the mouth of the Nile.

The fact that the club has almost fifty members indicates the general enthusiasm of Dal students for this new club.

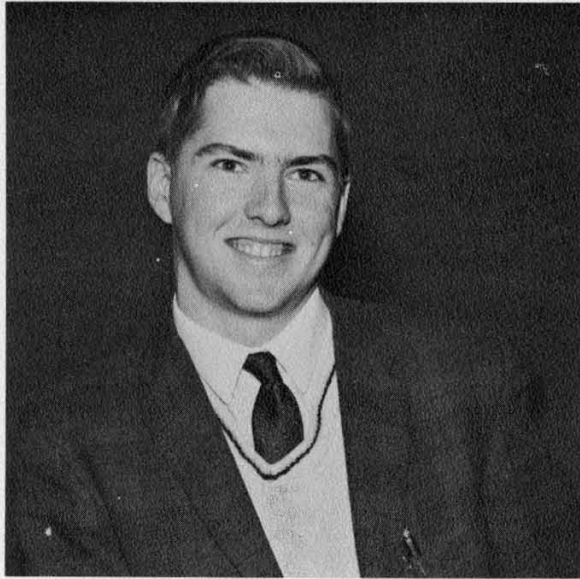
N.F.C.U.S.

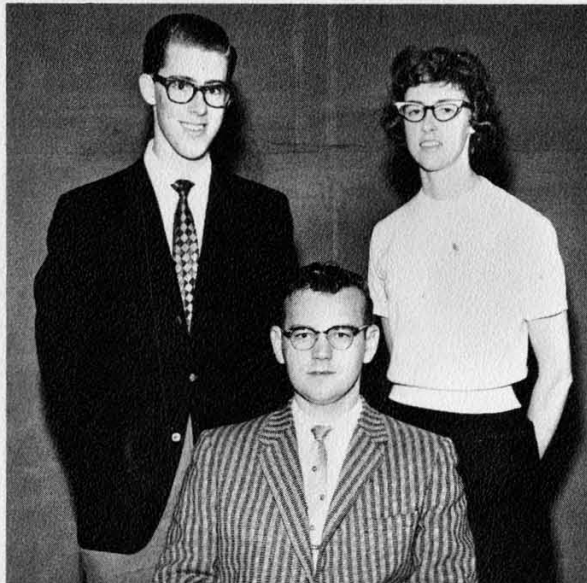

To give Anglican students the opportunity to celebrate the Eucharist, a 12:05 noon-day service of Holy Communion was held every Thursday in the Founder's Room.

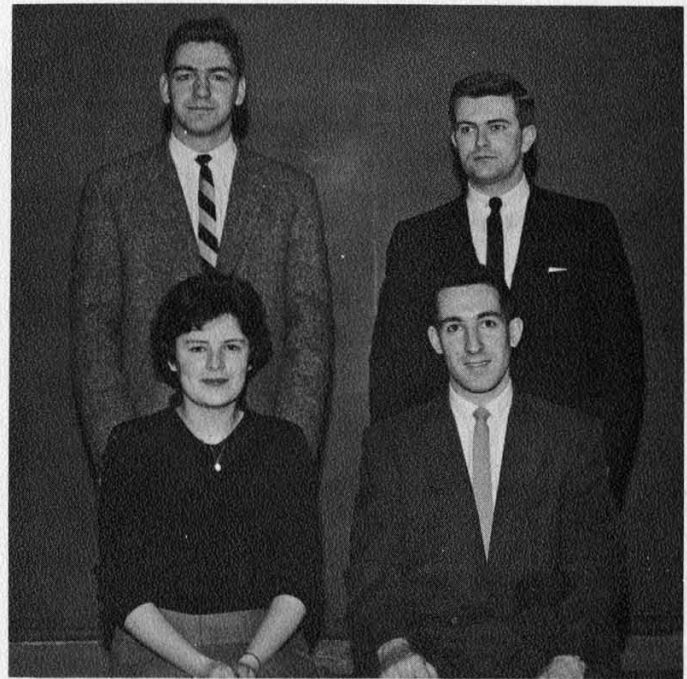

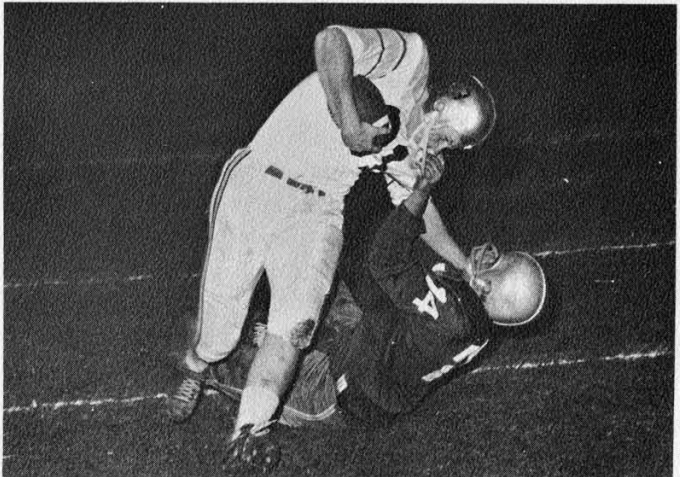
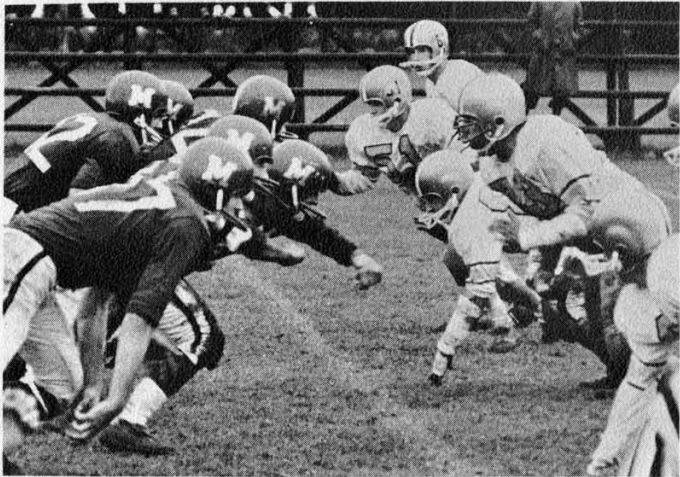
At the outset of this season Dalhousie, lacking experience and size, was given little chance of even making a
