WALTER CHARLES MURRAY, M. A. (Edin.), Hon. LL.D. (Queen's), F. R. S. C.—President of the University of Saskatchewan. Professor of Philosophy, Dalhousie University, 1892-1908. Author of various educational and historical papers.

FRANCIS CARMAN, B. A. (Toronto).—Formerly on staff of *Toronto Star* and *Montreal Star*. Since 1906 a member of the Parliamentary Press Gallery, Ottawa. Contributor to various Canadian and American magazines.

CARLETON FREDERICK BOWES, M. A. (Dalhousie).—Winner of a prize of \$100 in the Poetry Competition founded by Mr. W. H. Dennis, and open to all registered students at Dalhousie University. The jury of award recommended unanimously that the prize be given for the verses *Night and Day*.

WILLIAM CHARLES GOOD, B. A. (Toronto)—M. P. (Progressive Party) for Brant, Ontario. President of the Co-operative Union of Canada. Director of *The Farmers' Sun*. Formerly Vice-President of the U. F. O. Author of *Production and Taxation in Canada from the Farmers' Standpoint*. A frequent contributor to magazines and newspapers on economic and agricultural subjects.

JOHN ERSKINE READ, B. A., B. C. L. (Oxon.)—Professor of Law, Dalhousie University. Member of the Nova Scotia Bar.

CHESTER ELIJAH KELLOGG, M. A., Ph.D. (Harvard).—Professor of Psychology and Education, Acadia University. Psychological Examiner, Medical Department of United States Army, 1917-18. Chief of Educational Service, Base Hospitals, Camp Dodge, 1919-20. Grading and Testing Specialist, War Department, Field Service, 1920-21. Author of "Alternation and Interference of Feelings", *Psychological Monograph*, No. 79, and of various articles on psychological subjects.
