Editorial Guidelines for SSAC Bulletin Feature Articles

Persons wishing to contribute feature articles to the SSAC *Bulletin* should send one copy of their manuscript, with supporting illustrative material, to the Chairman, Editorial Board, SSAC *Bulletin*, P.O. Box 2935, Station 'D', Ottawa, Ontario K1P 5W9. To maintain editorial consistency, authors must, in preparing their manuscripts, conform to the editorial guidelines provided by the University of Chicago Press, **Manual of Style**.

Submission of General Information to the Bulletin

Board members as well as members at large are encouraged to submit general architectural information that would be of interest to the SSAC. The effectiveness of this publication as a national source for the study of architecture in Canada will be greatly enhanced by the timely contribution of such data. The following check list may be of assistance in formulating or collecting material for publication:

- Architectural conservation issue demolition, neglect of heritage building, restoration, renovation.
- □ Local heritage architectural group activities, meetings, newsletters, cost to join.
- New publications of interest author, title, publisher, cost.
- Conferences, courses, exhibitions subject matter, cost, dates, location and contact for more information.
- Architectural film, slide or lecture series where, when, cost.
- Local architects in the news contemporary designs for new projects, restoration or revitalization.
- Conservation or urban planning issues can the SSAC be of assistance to help save a heritage building in your area?
- Archival information addition to collection, exhibitions, inventory details.

The above list is intended as a guideline to assist in the preparation of information for the *Bulletin*. Subbmissions should be sent direct to the Editor, 2875 Haliday Crescent, Nanaimo, B.C. V9S 3N1, by the middle of the month preceeding the issue month as follows:

> mid-September for Issue #3, October mid-November for Issue #4, December


