**Heritage North Conference 1985 - Yellowknife.** Planning is presently underway to conduct the first ever all northern heritage conference in Yellowknife, North West Territories. Tentative dates for the meeting are 12 to 15 October, 1985.

1. Resources - availability of funding; staffing; preservation versus access
2. Communication - problems of distance, expense, culture
3. Jurisdiction - local versus federal, repatriation
