C. Baillairgé, Arct. Ing. Dessins architecturaux

The work of this celebrated 19th century Quebec architect was the subject of an exhibition in that city to mark International Archives week. A catalog accompanied the exhibit. The materials for both the exhibition and the catalog were drawn from the Baillairgé collection housed in the Quebec City municipal archive. This collection was the first archival collection to be designated under the Province of Quebec's cultural properties act. Such a designation affords permanent protection to the collection and allows the provincial government to subsidize conservation and restoration of the architectural drawings. The 24-page catalog shows details, sections, floorplans and elevations as well as the Baillairgé work schedule for April 20, 1886. Also included is a chart taken from his journals showing the number of hours he spent working on projects for the Corporation of the City from May 1, 1885 to April 30, 1886.
