ALLIANCE FOR HISTORIC LANDSCAPE PRESERVATION

The Alliance for Historic Landscape was formed in June 1978, and had its first meeting in June 1978.

The most important outcome of the Symposim was the formation of the Alliance for Historic Landscape Preservation. This group is composed of people actively involved in historic landscape preservation, who are familiar with and knowledgeable about its problems and are dedicated to its promotion through communication with others similarly involved. Membership in the group is invitational. The Alliance is not an organization. Rather than forming a new organization at this time, it was considered

preferable to use our energies to support existing organizations sympathetic to landscape preservation. Members will promote historic landscape preservation through their active participation in those organizations to which they already belong. The business of the Alliance will be handled temporarily by a steering committee composed of the organizers and adviser of the New Harmony Symposium. The next meeting of the Alliance is scheduled for June 1979, when the group will hear a series of papers on interdisciplinary roles in landscape preservation and discuss ways in which crucial interdisciplinary cooperation and understanding can most effectively be promoted. AN INVENTORY OF ARCHITECTURAL RECORDS

The Public Archives of Canada has recently published a descriptive guide to an inventory of architectural records assembled by Heritage Ottawa in 1976. Quoting from the quide: "The final product of the architectural inventory consists of eight portfolios containing inventory sheets for approximately 1,100 projects and biographical information collected by Peter Arends, a manual explaining the indexing system, a report chronicling the summer's activities, and three sets of cross-reference file cards. BRITISH COLUMBIA HERITAGE TRUST PUBLICATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The British Columbia Heritage Trust will support the publication of British Columbia related heritage material through a program of financial assistance. The first will consider application from individuals, societies and publishing companies. Assistance will be considered for publishing projects whose subject matter concerns the historic, cultural and built heritage of British Columbia. The types of publications eligible for support include popular guides, histories, handbooks of a documentary nature, local and regional histories, thematic monographs and technical handbooks; such publications should seek to improve public awareness of the Province's urban and rural heritage, promote its preservation, and provide information for laymen and professionals in conservation techniques.

HORWOOD COLLECTION

The Ontario Archives has recently received the J.C.B. and E.C. Horwood Collection of Architectural Drawings, a collection of over 10,000 drawings of 1,200 buildings by 55 architects covering a time period of 150 years. Represented are a great number of the names who have shaped Ontario's architectural history, including, F.W. Cumberland, Langley's, Petch, Sheard, Strickland, Tully, and many others. A preliminary list has been prepared to advise researchers of the general content of the collection. However, the collection itself is closed pending the completion of scheduled conservation, and full archival processing.

CHINATOWN, VANCOUVER

"Celebration in Chinatown" is Heritage West's feature article in their latest issue. It outlines the program recently undertaken to beautify Vancouver's Chinatown, with the help of a \$700,000 budget contributed by the Province, the City, and the property owners. The area has been designated as an Historic site, and present work will focus on changes in sides walks intersections, lighting, landscaping, and other features. The use of the area as an important shopping district will be maintained.

WANTED...AN AUTHOR

The Vancouver Heritage Advisory Committee is seeking an author, of particular talents, to write a social and architectural history of Vancouver as revealed through a study of its built heritage.

The particular talents being sought are, on the one hand, the scholarly ability to inform the most discerning professional regarding the influences of developing social patterns upon architectural styles and neighbourhood development, and, on the other hand, a writing style having vivid appeal for the general public, school children, and visitors to the city.

The Heritage Committee, through its own investigations and through many inquiries received, has long perceived a need for such a book, not only as a City information resource, but also as a desirable means of promoting an appreciation of this city's own unique and worthy identity, and of the value of heritage conservation in Vancouver.

It is hoped that preliminary studies and inventories, undertaken last year, will be continued this summer through student grants. In the meantime, a sub-committee will be meeting to discuss, with potential authors, questions of content, format, funding and marketing.

ESTABLISHMENT OF WORLD HERITAGE LIST

The Convention Concerning the Protection of World Cultural and Natural Heritage, set up six years ago with a mandate to identify and protect sites of cultural and natural heritage having outstanding universal value, has now produced its first list of approved sites. Sites representing cultural heritage are: L'Anse Aux Meadows National Historic Park, Canada; City of Quito, Equador; Rock Hewn Churches, Lalibela, Ethiopia; Aachen Cathedral, Federal Republic of West Germany; Cracov's Historical and Architectural Urban Centre, Polish People's Republic; Wieliczka Salt Mine, Polish People's Republic; Island of Gorée, Republic of Senegal; Mesa Verde National Park, United States of America. INSTITUTE OF ADVANCED ARCHITECTURAL STUDIES

A two-week course concerned with the principles and methods to be applied to the evaluation and subsequent conservation of historic structures in stone and timber so that their value as factual evidence remains unimpaired. The introduction to the course will outline current legislation and financial grants applicable to historic buildings and towns in Britain; but the emphasis of the course, which is intended primarily for those professionally concerned with conservation work on buildings and monuments, will be on the treatment of structures. The course is arranged by the Institute of Advanced Architectural Studies in collaboration with the British Council and the Department of the Environment. The whole period of study will be based in York, and will include lectures, discussions, visits and some free time. Participants should be prepared to give a short (20 mins) talk on conservation work in their own countries.
