Web Advisory Committee Annual Report to Library Council 2019-2020

The Web Advisory Committee held two meetings between 1 July 2019 and 30 June 2020. After having served as Chair & Web Publisher for more than a year, Shelley McKibbon resigned but continued to serve as Kellogg representative on the committee. In February 2020, Associate Dean Resources/ Discovery Michelle Paon agreed to serve as Interim Chair of the committee. Although it has proven difficult to recruit a Web Publisher, two committee members have offered to assume several of the responsibilities of this role on an interim basis. Alex Wojcik agreed to serve as the committee's contact with the Dalhousie Campus Web Team (for example, attending meetings and consulting with Team members on technical issues). Marlo MacKay agreed to make corrections and updates to the Dal Libraries website, as needed.

On-going Projects

- Develop a plan for ongoing accuracy audits of Libraries website.
 - Aligns with Interim Strategic Plan priority 1.1(b)
 - The committee's goal had been to prepare a plan for ongoing accuracy audits of the Libraries website, but with the onset of COVID-19, these plans have been put on hold. As it turns out, COVID-related modifications to Libraries services and resources (eg. to Document Delivery, Course eReserves, laptop loans, streaming video licensing, etc) have triggered updates to related Libraries webpages, resulting in unanticipated but useful revisions to the website.
- Enact website accessibility assessment
 - The committee will cooperate with the Campus Web Team in implementing changes to improve accessibility of the Library's website. *Aligns with Interim Strategic Plan priority 1.1 (a)*
- Maintain awareness of recently-initiated development work on: the Dal Libraries' Academic Technology Services (ATS) webpage and an Instructional Technologies sub-page (committee was alerted to discussions in May 2020); and the Dal Libraries' Research Commons (research cycle) webpages.

Completed / Launched Projects (to June 30, 2020)

- Selected and activated a new background image for the Libraries homepage.
- Retired the home page background image of the Killam Library atrium at night. The Committee
 gratefully acknowledges the creative work of Dal Libraries ATS staff member Mike Duggan,
 photographer of the atrium image.
- During the COVID-19 campus closures, Marlo MacKay and Alex Wojcik worked on a number of website initiatives to alert Dal Libraries users to service and resource offerings:
 - o Prepared and posted a COVID banner to the Libraries home page.
 - o Created Libraries COVID-19 updates webpage.
 - o Added "COVID-19" link to the upper menu on Libraries home page.
 - Began work to revise Quick Links menu wording. ie. to change "Study Room Bookings" to "Book a Study Room or Computer (New!)".
 - o Drafted an underlying webpage to describe the study space booking service, in preparation for anticipated July opening of bookable spaces in two of the Libraries' Learning Commons.
- Identified an updated list of page authors of the Libraries webpages.

Future Plans

- The committee will discuss the InSync results as they relate to the Libraries website.
- There is some indication that Dalhousie may embark on a new design for its university website. The Web Advisory Committee will monitor any upcoming Campus Web Team discussions in this regard. In consideration of this prospect, a tentative plan to do website assessment and user testing of the Dal Libraries website in 2020 (four years after launch of the current website) is currently on hold. The COVID-related workload experienced by Libraries staff would also make such a major initiative very challenging for committee members at present. In the short term, a more realistic goal may be to focus on revisions to or retirement of specific targeted webpages.
