### **In Memoriam – Dr. Paul Kẹhinde Joseph, MBBS, FRCPC**

It is with sadness that we announce the passing of Dr. Paul Kẹhinde Joseph on June 3, 2018. He passed away surrounded by his family.

A leading Radiation Oncologist and Assistant Professor at Dalhousie University, Dr. Joseph's efforts were integral in molding cancer treatment in Nova Scotia. He was instrumental in the establishment of the Cape Breton Cancer Centre and when the QEII Health Sciences Centre was created he became the Head of the Cancer program there. He went on to become the first President of Medical Staff in the QEII, where he continuously advocated for the maintenance of its cancer program, and worked with the QEII Foundation to make cancer research their first major funding target. He also represented Nova Scotia at the Canadian Association of Provincial Cancer Agencies.

He was a tireless advocate for his patients. His leadership will be deeply missed in the health care system of Nova Scotia.

Dr. Joseph was predeceased by his parents, Evaristus Ayodele Joseph and Valentine Fọlụsade Joseph (Ogunade), brothers, Peter Taiwo, Augustine Olufẹmi, Charles Alaba and sister, Antonia Oluremi (Oludi). He will be missed by his children, Marissa Bukola (Laszlo), Richard Adetokunbo, Anthony Ayodele; his grandson, Braeden Kayinoluwa Molnar; his sisters, Elizabeth Idowu Kuforiji, Catherine Tinuke Adegoke and all of their spouses, sister-in-law, Elizabeth Modupe; his nieces and nephews, and his extended family and friends.
