Dear Colleague,

The Office of Part-time Studies and Extension is pleased to inform you that it offers, as part of its Self-instructional Language Program, the possibility of studying basic French from tape recordings in the Dalhousie Learning Laboratory.

The recordings constitute a carefully-programmed course covering the pronunciation and all the basic structures of spoken and written French. No previous knowledge is assumed. The course can also be useful to those who are not beginners: with or without a rapid review of earlier units, they may begin at any advanced point they find appropriate.

Starting at the very beginning, the material of the course can be covered in about 250 hours of listening and practice - but individual differences make this figure only approximate. Since constant contact with the spoken language is important, learners are advised to visit the Lab frequently - five to ten hours a week if at all possible. There are no classes, tests or examinations. The course may be begun at any time of the year.

The French taught is the standard language as used by educated people wherever French is spoken. Emphasis is on the spoken word, but all necessary instruction on writing is also

included. The tapes are accompanied by a set of texts. Volumes 1 and 2 of Elements for Self-expression in French (by F. Marty) are available from Dalhousie Book Store; a pamphlet on the Sounds of French is available from Part-time Studies.

Learners are free to use the excellent facilities of the Learning Lab (situated in the basement of the Killam Library) as often as they wish during open times (day, evening and weekend hours are usually available: for more precise information phone the Lab at 3692). A principal advantage of self-instruction is the freedom to work at one's own rate of speed and at hours that can be fitted into a busy timetable of activities.

This non-credit course is accessible without charge (except for books) to any member of the Dalhousie Faculty or Staff (as well as to students). All that is required is to register with Part-time Studies (6100 University Avenue, telephone 2375), where further information may be also obtained. Professor Harry Aikins would be pleased to consult with you and advise you at your convenience.
