CELE FRY scored a perfect 29 point hand in one of the many lunch time cribbage games, eventually winning the game by 45 points.

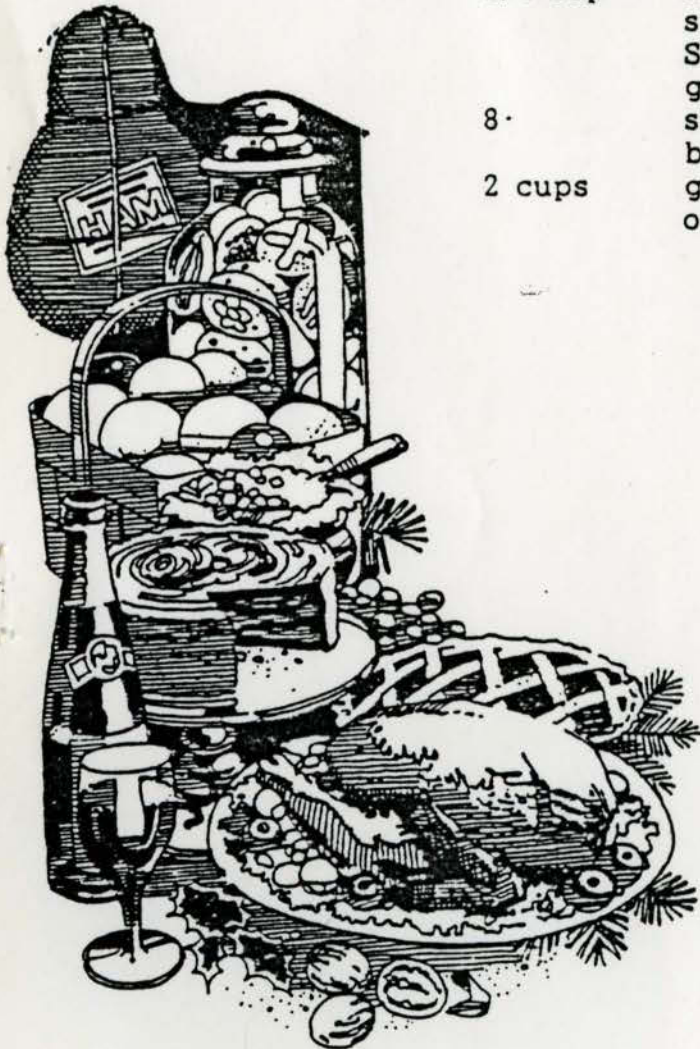
AD HOC COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE FUTURE OF EXPANDED FUNCTIONS FOR HYGIENE STUDENTS

RECIPE OF THE MONTH
ONION SOUP AU GRATIN

The sweetness of Spanish onions adds a special flavor to this adaptation of French onion soup.

1/4 cup	butter	50 mL
2 tbsp	vegetable oil	25 mL
2	Spanish onions, thinly sliced	2
1 tbsp	granulated sugar	15 mL
6 cups	beef broth or consommé	1.5 L
1/4 cup	Madeira or sherry	50 mL
	Salt and freshly ground pepper	
8	slices French bread, toasted	8
2 cups	grated Gruyère or Swiss cheese	500 mL



In large saucepan, heat butter and oil over medium-high heat; add onions and sprinkle with sugar. Cook, stirring occasionally, for 15 to 20 minutes or until onions are soft and golden brown. Add broth and bring to boil; reduce heat and simmer, uncovered, for 15 to 20 minutes. Add Madeira. Taste and add salt and pepper if necessary.

Ladle hot soup into 8 individual oven-proof bowls. Float bread slice in each bowl and sprinkle each with 1/4 cup (50 mL) cheese. Broil 3 inches (7 cm) from heat until cheese is golden brown. Makes 8 servings.
