Samantha was a gentle and generous spirit, always thoughtful of and kind to others. Her luminous presence touched many. She was loved by all those who knew and interacted with her.

Samantha is survived, and sorely missed, by her mother, Jane Li (Belleville, Ont.); father, Stephen Payne (Halifax); partner, Andrew Gormley (Halifax) and aunt Jacqueline Kinsman (Timaru, NZ). She leaves her little cat, Pepper.

Visitation will be held at 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m., Thursday July 16, followed by a service celebrating her life at 2 p.m., Friday, July 17.
