## ROYAL INSTITUTION.

A General meeting is to be held on Thursday the 29th of this month at two o'clock precisely in pursuance of Byelaws Chap. XVI, and particularly Art. 2, in order to elect three Scientific and literary committees.

1. A committee of Mathematics, mechanics, and mechanical inventions; to consist of 25 members, not being managers or visitors: to meet on Mondays.
2. A committee of Chemistry, geology, and mineralogy; 25 members, not being managers or visitors: to meet on Tuesdays.
3. A committee of General science, literature, and the arts; 25 members, not being managers or visitors: to meet on Fridays.

All to continue in office till the week following the annual election of officers in May 1811, when the whole of the instruction printed, in pursuance of the Byelaws, at foot of the three inclosed balloting lists will become fully applicable.

Professors of the Institution may attend each committee, and, if members of the Institution, may vote.

Managers and Visitors are ex officio of each committee.

The Ballot will close at three o'clock precisely, unless enlarged by vote.
