 - d. Dalhousie is now a full fledged member of ASIN portal to support Relais
 - e. CrossSearch and link resolver provides an opportunity to learn to use these types of environments
 - i. Learn about products in ASIN portal
 - ii. Make a decision about switching over in September/October 2005 when the CrossSearch license is due to renew
 - iii. Decide if we will support ASIN portal
 - f. Challenges for Public Services
 - i. What digital resources should we provide?
 - ii. What new products and services are out there?
 - iii. Continually ask, What is public services today?
