Forasmuch as by a mutuall agreement Well whose names and subscribed & patented or Adventurers and of the Comroull of New England are to regard in the surrender to his Ma^{tie} of the great Charter of this Country which was granted unto us in the Eighteenth yeare of the Reigne of Kinge James of blessed memory in whose presence we were drawne for settling of divers and sondry divisions of lande on the Sea Coast of the said Country upon most of us, who hitherto have bene confirmed in the said lande soe allotted. And to the intent that every one of us according to equitie and in reasonable manner and according to his Adventurers or other interest may enjoy a proportion of the lands of the said Country, to be immediately Lordson of his Ma^{tie} Well therefore doe hereby and agree that all that part of the Country aforesaid shall belonge to the right hon^{ble} Edward Lord Gorges. To beginne at the middle of the West entrance of the Naragansett and soe to proceed alonge the Coast Eastwards to Cape Codd and round about the same bearing North Eastwards to Namekerk which is on the East side of the Bay of the Massachusetts and from thence North East into the land One hundred and twenty myles All from the West mount or entrance of the Naragansett continuinge by the Redstone Clime of the same to the head thereof, and from thence into the land Northwestwards till One hundred and twenty myles be finished, from the first Entrance From which period to the first our land to the hundred and twenty myles end accounted West from Namekerk as aforesaid together with ten thousand acres on the East part of Sagadahock, Saving and reserving out of this division to every one that hath any lawfull grant of lands or plantations lawfully settled in the same the full hundredth and enjoyment of his right with the liberties thereunto appertaininge layinge downe his Jura Regalia (if he have any) to the proprietors of this division whom in his lands he gett And payms some small acknowledgement for that he is now to hold his said lands anew of the proprietors of this division.
