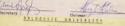

A final area in which the Committee believed that little, if maything, had been accomplished was that related to student use of resource naterials, especially library resources.

The approaches to this question were taken early in April. 1. Mrs. D. Cooks, the University Librarian, Professor Hary Bykarra and Mr. Alam McMagham, Student him Representative, were provided with an opportunity to discuss the issue with the Deans of the various Esculties on campus.

Part of one of the seminars on Practical Teaching was devoted to the use of the Library.

These approaches led to some lively discussions and to a broad range of suggestions for silevisting the problem but failed to produce a specific solution to the bests problem.

It would appear that, as expected, a large number of first year students do not use the Library. Desprisingly it was pointed out that some Fourth year students had not yet acquired the skill.

It was progressed by both the librarians and the students that the problem might be met if professors and librariane recognized the serieumnes of the problem and resolved to address themselves to it.

Professors might bely by:

(a) Reing familiar with the Library themselves.

(b) Giving correct citations to students in a standard form. Recogning students to learn how to use the Library and look for neterial themselves by reducing the amount of reading natural put on reserve.

The Librarians might help by:

Reconsidering and restructuring the Iraditional "library tours". These have been badly attended and not seen by students as sufficient orientation to a Library such as the Balbousie Killss Library.

(b) The Library could organize a series of loctures, films, sclivitias, etc. that, offered over a period of time, could orient students to the broad rungs of services that are available in a modern library.

Leaving saids times questions which are of peculiar cool Faculty of Craduate Studies, we think that there are two issues of importance from the standard of the Faculty of Arts and Dollmon.

(1) The Report wishes to distinguish between centres for the education of elementary teachers, and centres for the education of sepondary teachers. The Nova Scotia Teachers College and Novet St. Viscent University would be designated as contres princilly for elementary teachers, while Delhousie and other university departments of Education

Advisory Committee on Appointment of Health Sciences Librarian

At the meeting of Senate Council on December 4 is was agreed that in consultation between Vice-President Veglanos, the Deans of Medicine, Destistry and Health Professions, a proposal would be made to Senate today for a committee to advise on the appointment of a Mealth Sciences Librarias. After consultation the following is proposed for consideration by Senate for the composition of an advisory committee concerning the appointment of a Sealth Sciences Librarian when the post becomes vacant in January 1979.

The committee shall consist of eight nambers as follows:

- A professional librarian from the Kellopy Health Sciences Library appointed by the Vice-Fresident (Administration) after consultation with professional librarians of that library - A professional librarian from the University Lineary System
- (preferably a science librarian) appointed by the Vice-President (Administration) after consultation with librarians in the Killas Library (including the Macdonald Science Library) - A student appointed on the nomination of the Dean of
- Medicine after consultation between him and the Denna of Destistry and Smalth Professions
- The Vice-President (Administration)

The committee would select its own chairman, and would seek nominations and applications through publicising its smistence and advertising in a manner similar to the procedures approved by Sanato for appointments of Deans and Assistant Deans. He said that, in response to the debates in Senate on January 16 and 22, the Committee wishes to offer the following amendments and clarifications to Sections (2) and (6) of its Report.

Section (2) Officers of Senate

- With respect to Officers of Senate, the Committee recommends
- (1) that Senate elect its own executive officers, and that these isclude a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman and a Secretary, or it cases where the President or a Vice-President is elected Chairman, a Chairman, a First Vice-Chairman, a Second Vice-Chairman, and a Secretary;
- (2) that officers of Senate hold office for three-year terms, with the possibility of remeval in the case of both the Chairman and the Secretary;
- (3) that if the President or a Vice-President is elected Chairmen of Semale, as additional Vice-Chairmen, destinated the Thrat Vice-Chairmen, half also be elected, but shall not be used from bloom or a Vice-President.
