“Before I proceed in this ceremony, I think it necessary to state to you, gentlemen, the object and intention of this important work; I think it necessary to do this because I have never yet made any public declaration of the nature of the Institution I am here planting among you, and because I know that some part of the public imagine that it is intended to oppose the college already established at Windsor. This College of Halifax is founded for the instruction of youth in the higher Classics and in all Philosophical studies; it is formed in imitation of the University of Edinburgh; its doors will be open to all who profess the Christian religion; to the youth of His Majesty’s North American Colonies, to strangers residing here, to gentlemen of the military as well as the learned professions, to all, in short, who may be disposed to devote a small part of their time to study. It does not oppose the King’s College at Windsor, because it is well known that college does not admit any students unless they subscribe to the tests required by the Established Church of England, and these tests exclude the great proportion of the youth of this Province. It is therefore particularly intended for those who are excluded from Windsor; it is founded upon the principles of religious toleration secured to you by the laws, and upon that paternal protection which the King of England extends to all his subjects. It is under His Majesty’s most gracious approbation of this institution that I meet you here today, and as his humble representative I lay this corner-stone of the building. I here perform an act which appears to me to promise incalculable advantages to this country; and if my name, as Governor of the Province, can be associated with your future well-being, it is upon the foundation of this college that I could desire to rest it. From this college every blessing may flow over your country; in a few months hence it may dispense those blessings to you whom I now address; may it continue to dispense them to the latest ages! Let no jealousy disturb its peace; let no lukewarm indifference check its growth! Protect it in its first years, and it will abundantly repay your care!”

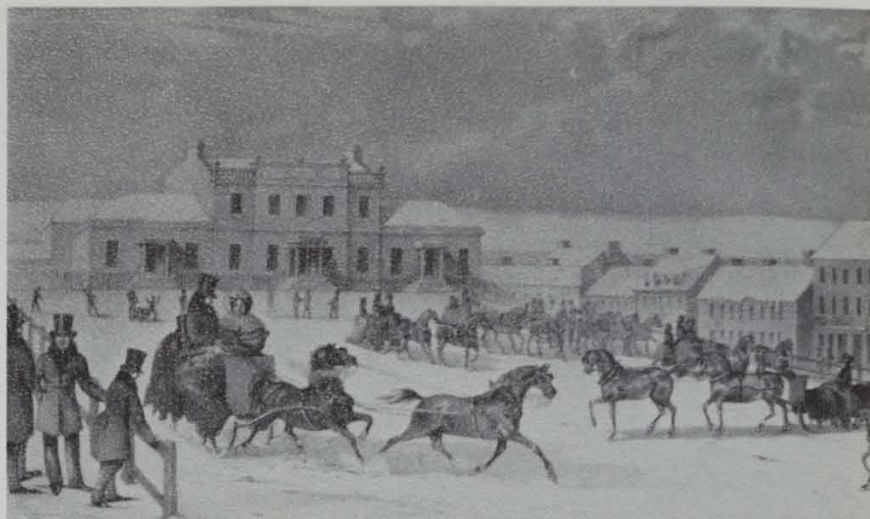

The original Dalhousie College on the Grand Parade

During the war of 1812 British land and sea forces took the fort and town of Castine, Maine, located at the foot of the Penobscot river. British occupation of Castine lasted from September 1814 until the Treaty of Ghent in 1815. During the seven months occupation the British commander exercised all the rights of sovereignty and collected duties, amounting to 11, 596.18.9, on goods imported into the the Castine area. These duties were returned to the Commissary General at Halifax.

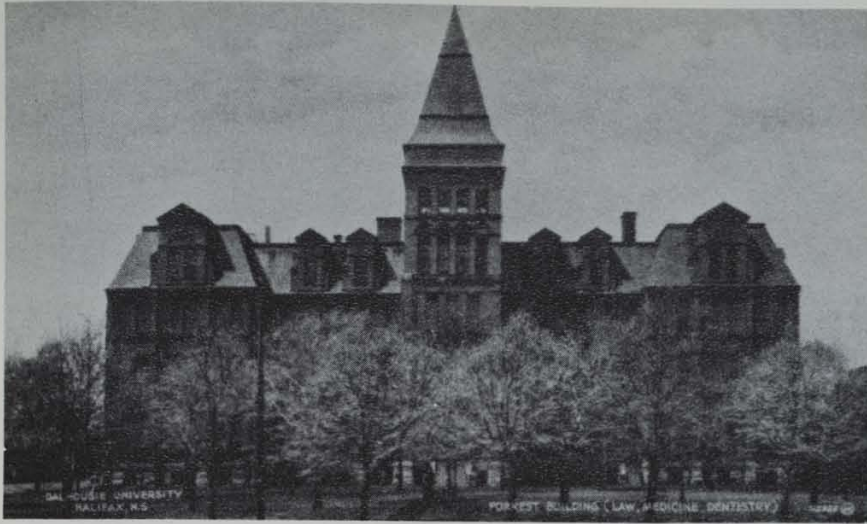
George Ramsay, the Ninth Earl of Dalhousie, Lieutenant Governor in 1817, conceived and proposed that these funds be devoted to founding a college of liberal learning open to all. In all the Canadian dominions the only institution of higher education was King's College, open only to students of the Anglican faith and entirely controlled by the church of England. In 1818 the Colonial Secretary, Lord Bathurst, gave approval for the allocation of the remaining 10,750 of the Castine fund. The institution founded with these monies became Dalhousie University.

Trustees were appointed to guide the formative stages of the college along the lines of the University of Edinburgh. The site of the Grand Parade was granted for the erection of the college. Halifax City Hall now stands, on the original site of the college, on the square still known as the Grand Parade. Construction finally commenced in 1819. George Ramsay's last public act in Nova Scotia, before becoming Governor General, was the laying of the cornerstone in 1820. The Nova Scotia Legislature named the college in his tribute in 1821.

The first two rooms were ready in 1822, but by 1823 Dalhousie, still non-operational, was in debt and under heavy criticism. This antagonism is expressed in Thomas Haliburton's first account of Nova Scotia, anonymously published in 1823; "This establishment has not yet it's professorships filled nor is it probable they will be for some time. It is on all sides unanimously deplored that so much money should have been so injudiciously expended. One college is at present sufficient for the two Provinces of Nova Soctia and New Brunswick, and it is feared by the endowment of two, both may dwindle into insignificance. Of all places the center of a garrison Town and Sea Port, like Halifax, is perhaps the most unsuitable for an establishment, which containing only lecture rooms, leaves its pupils exposed to dissipation, without one salutary check or restraint. Had these funds been appropriated to the endowment of new professorships at King's College at Windsor, to the enlargement of its Library, and the erection of new buildings, which are much required for the accommodation of its officers and students, the public would have been greatly benefitted and the cause of Literature much better served than it is at present." Under community pressure and in debt, the physical facilities of the college were rented to the civic authorities for civic offices and stabling purposes.

It was 1838 before the Trustees of Dalhousie College appointed the first President, Reverend Dr. Thomas McCulloch. McCulloch an ardent reformer, friend of Joseph Howe, and previously at the Pictou Academy; was also appointed to the Professorships of Logic, Rhetoric, and Moral Philosophy. The first students were enrolled on November 1st the same year. It was not until 1841 that University powers were granted to Dalhousie College. McCulloch died in 1843. In 1844 the university closed, partially due to his death and the resignation of professors. Underlying the closure was the fact that the Legislature failed to renew the university's grant, during its growing concern for responsible government.

In 1848 responsible government undertook to revive the university. The new University Board of Government was chaired by W. Young. Joseph Howe began his forty years on the Board (1848-1888) in this same year. In 1849 friction among professors, difficulty collecting fees, low attendance and poor morale characterized the institution. By 1854 the school closed again, with the Board resolving to a new administration. During the cholera panic that summer the facilities served as a hospital. It was not until 1856 that Dalhousie reopened, this time remaining open four years before it was closed because of recurring low morale and low attendance.

A government bill for the re-organization of Dalhousie University became law in 1863. Largely because of the influence of Joseph Howe and W. Young, the Board of Governors maintained their independence of denominational control by resisting temptation of immediate advantage or religious prejudice. As a result Dalhousie became the first university in Canada to write religious tolerance into its charter. It was with the appointment of Ross as the second President and this government bill that Dalhousie began to prosper.

The Medical Faculty was organized in 1868, and the first Dalhousie Gazette went to press in 1869. The Gazette is Canada's oldest college newspaper. In 1872 Dalhousie was still the only non-sectarian college in Nova Scotia but managed to continue its success. In 1877 the Faculty of Science was organized. The first of many contributions from George Munro was received in 1879.

George Munro was born in 1825 in Pictou County. He learned printing with the local paper, and taught mathematics in New Glasgow and later Halifax. He left Halifax in 1856 for New York, taking various jobs available. In 1863 he became a clerk with a dime novel publishing firm. The following year he started his own publishing house and in 1867 began publishing THE FIRESIDE COMPANION, which had a phenomenal circulation. He published THE SEASIDE LIBRARY a series of nearly 2,000 titles encompassing virtually all the classics of English Literature. Since he paid no royalties to authors he saved considerable sums, at their expense, in these publishing ventures. Beginning in 1879 his gifts to Dalhousie, eventually totalling \$350,000, endowed professorships, tutorships and scholarships. He also substantially endowed the University of the City of New York, during times when endowments were relatively unheard of. His endowments to Dalhousie allowed the university to progress without dependence on the small and precarious provincial grants.

Women students were admitted to Dalhousie in 1881. Further endowments, after the fashion of George Munro, totalling \$254,000, were received in 1882 from other prominent citizens. These citizens were: John McNab, Sir William Young, Alexander McLeod, John P. Mott, and Joseph Matheson. In 1883 the Faculty of Law was started with Richard Chapman Weldon as Dean. Thirty-six years after his appointment as Chairman of the Board, in 1884 Sir W. Young retired.

Dalhousie's third President Reverend John Forrest, professor and governor, was appointed in 1885 to succeed Ross who resigned after twenty-two years in the position. Reverend Forrest was George Munro's brother-in-law. In 1887 Dalhousie exchanged the facilities, site, and Grand Parade with the City of Halifax. The university received the site of the present Forrest Building and \$25,000. The Forrest Building, the second Dalhousie, was constructed from these funds and an additional \$20,000 given by Sir W. Young. In 1908 the Dentistry Faculty was founded. In 1911, twenty years after his appointment Reverend Forrest resigned. He was succeeded by Dr. Stanley MacKenzie the fourth President of Dalhousie University.

When the quarters of the Forrest Building became cramped in 1912 the university bought a beautiful estate of forty acres, Studley. For this purchase public funds totalling \$400,000 were raised. The first building on the Studley campus, the Science building (the present Chemistry building) was started that same year. An initial endowment for a library was received from Professor Charles MacDonald amounting to \$2,000. Professor Johnston bequeathed \$1,000 and a number of his personal books to the library. Another \$25,000 was publicly raised and the MacDonald Library was started in 1914. It was in 1914 that Dean Weldon resigned, ending thirty-one years as Law School Dean. The first two buildings on the Studley campus were opened for occupancy in 1915.

1923 marked one of the university's biggest gains, when the University of King's College, the oldest university in Canada and former opposition, moved from Windsor, Nova Scotia, to Halifax and affiliated with Dalhousie.



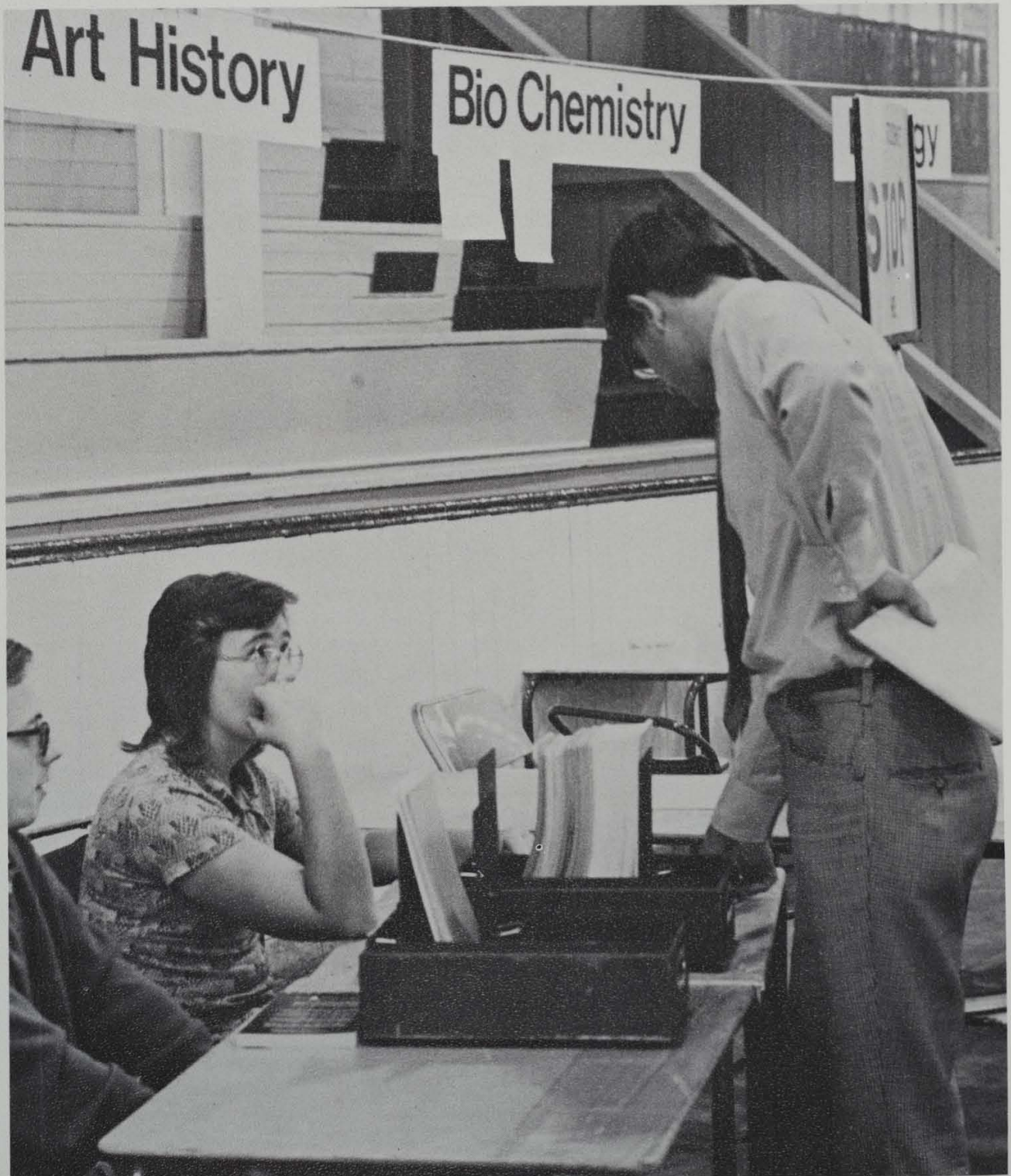

But for now - farewell, and success along your pathway of life.

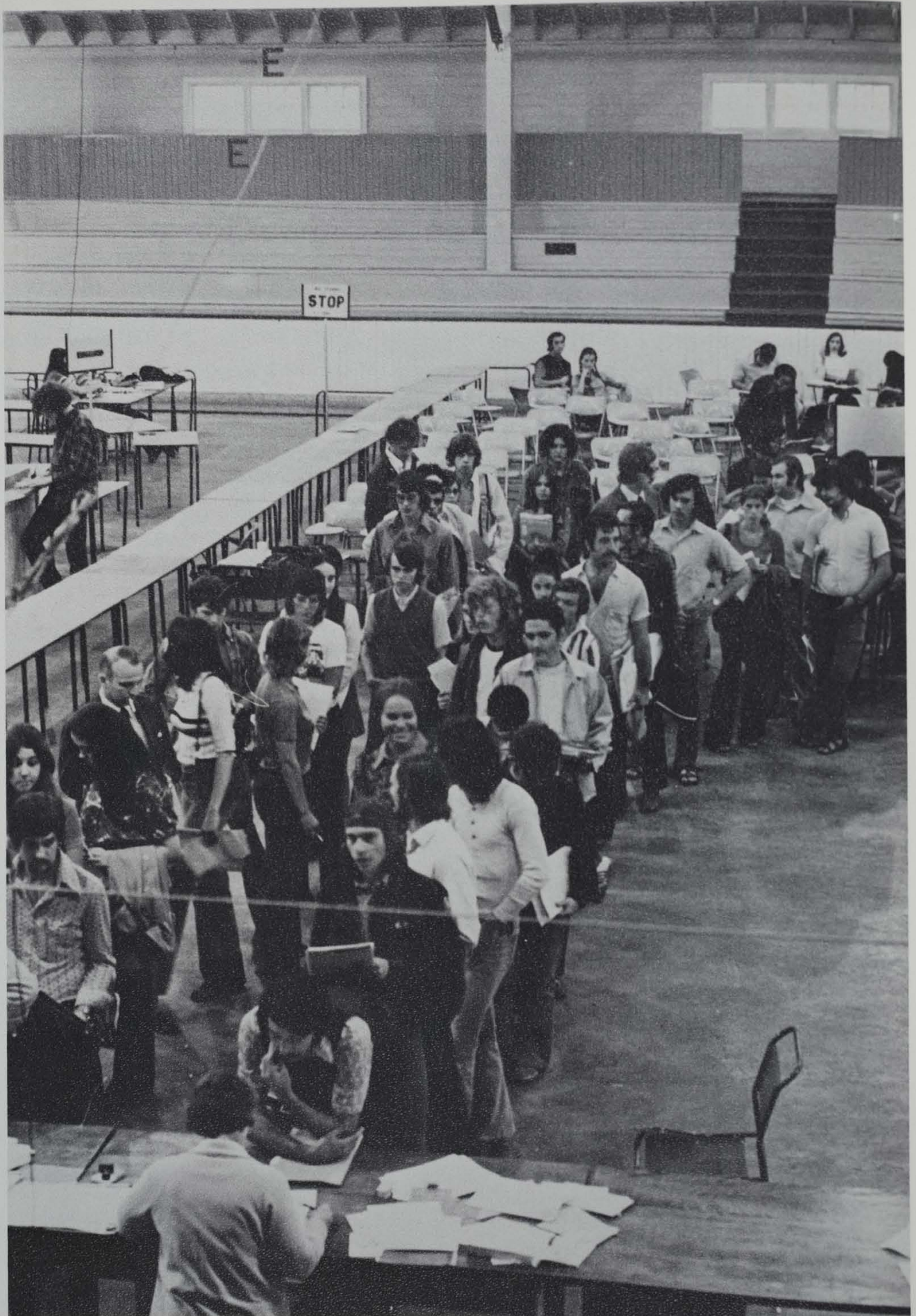

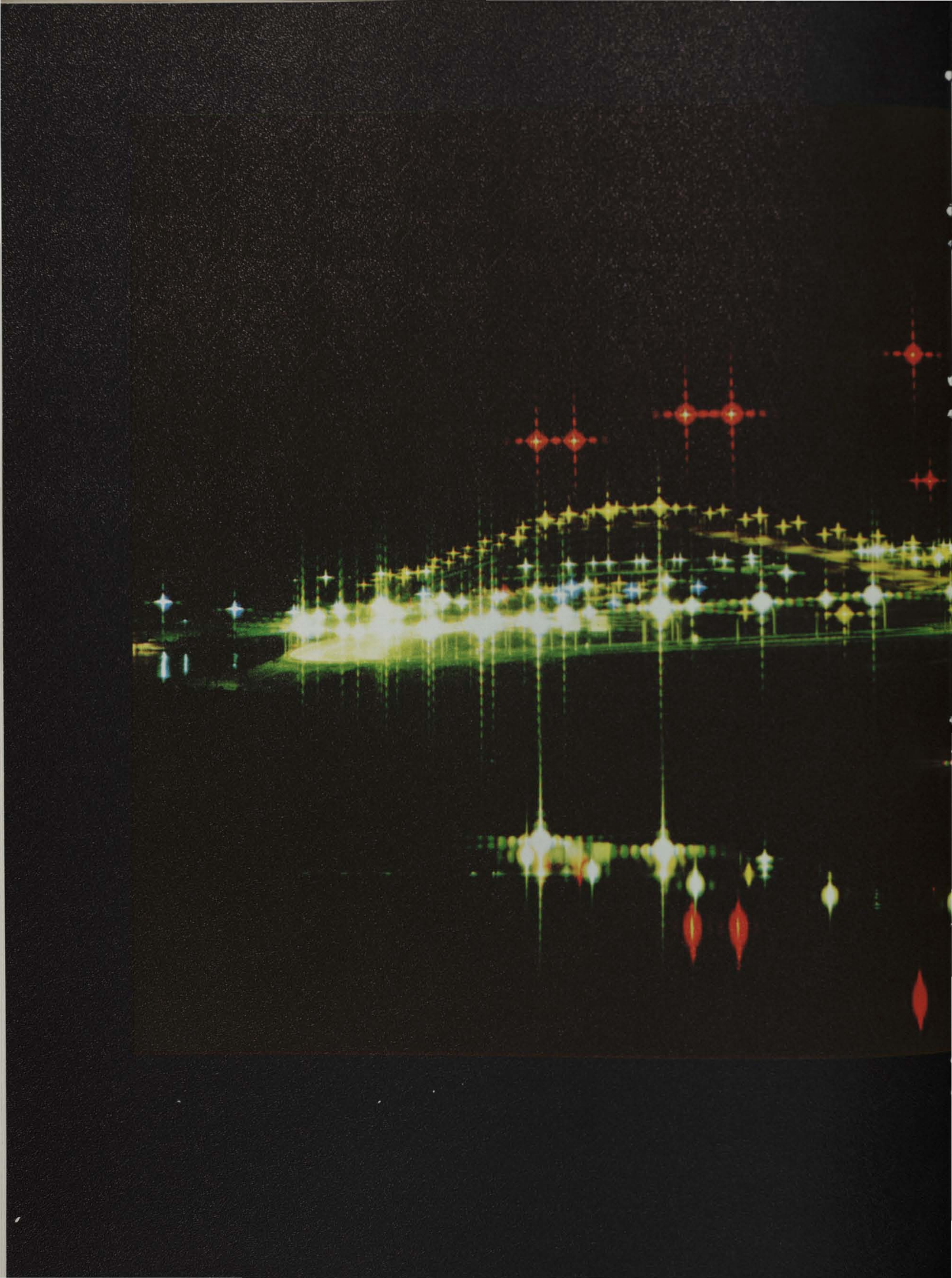




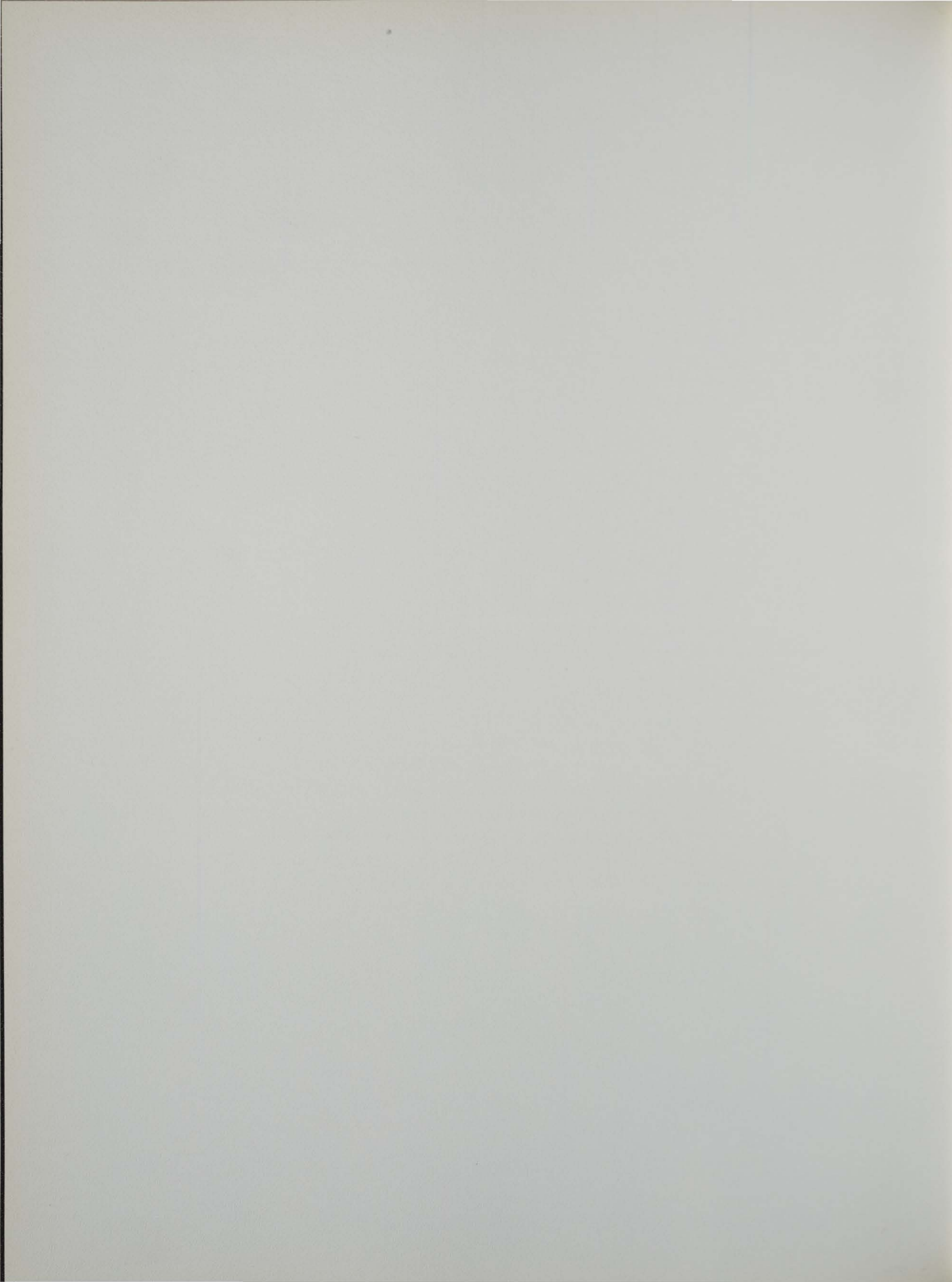












## Don Quixote

I have seen the strong survive and I have seen the lean grow weak."

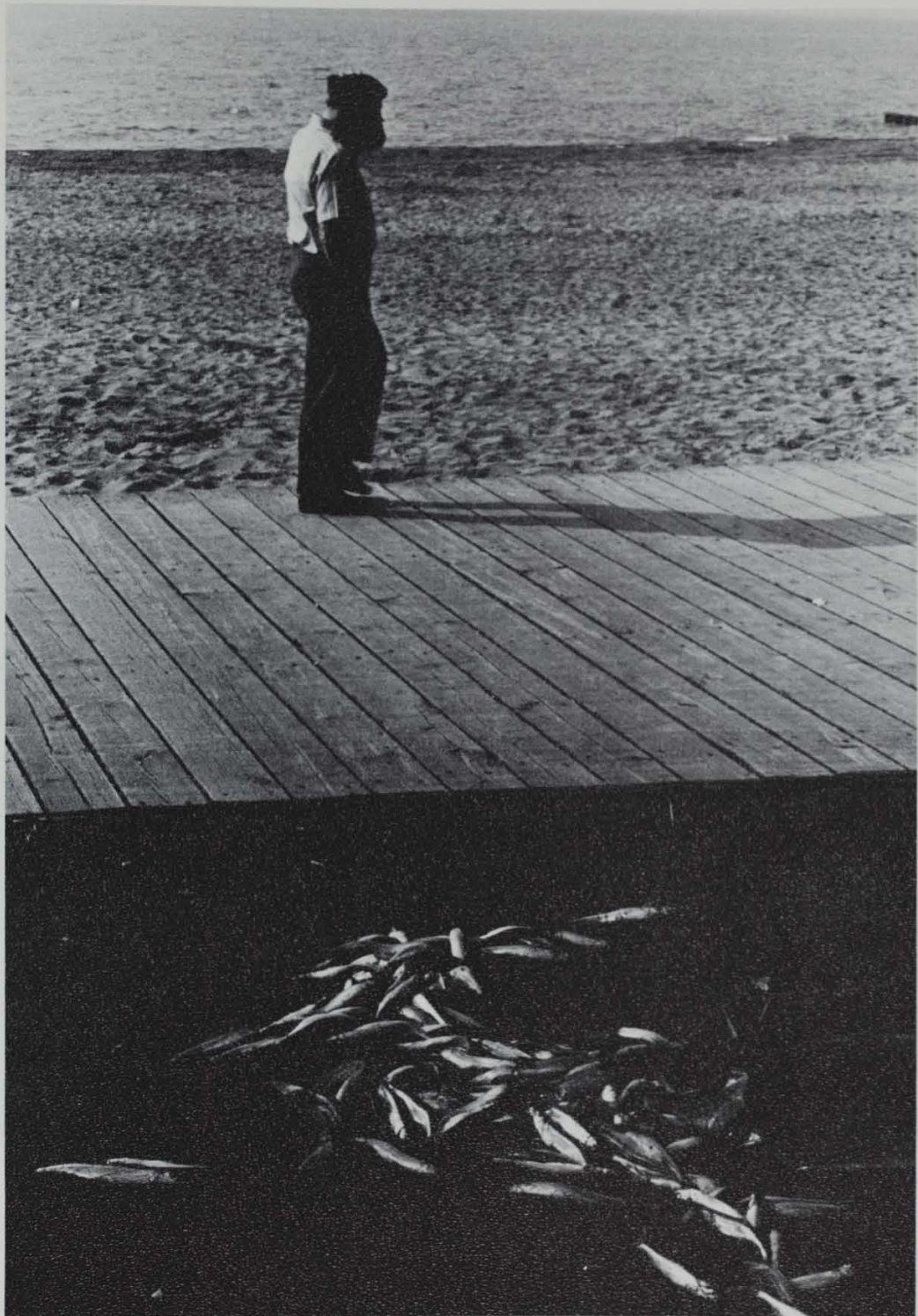
See the children of the earth who wait to find the table there
