

I am in support because the health of Atlantic Canadians remains far behind the rest of Canada and because Atlantic Canadian women: have been excluded from the bulk of Canadian health research to date ... have considerably higher stress rates than men & the highest blood pressure in the country ... have higher rates of environmental illness, cancers & asthma, as well as the highest rates of female cancer deaths in Canada... have among the highest Canadian rates of pay inequity ... are among the poorest in our Canadian society with the highest provincial female & child poverty rates.
