- Hugh Martin.—A distinguished London journalist, who visited Canada with other representatives of the British press last fall. Mr. Martin is well-known for his articles in the London Daily News. During recent years he has been press correspondent in some of the stormiest centres, from which he wrote at once with unfailing courage and high descriptive power.
- E. O. FEWSTER.—A medical practitioner in Vancouver, B. C. Founder and President of the Vancouver Poetry Club. Dr. Fewster has published verse that has been highly commended, and much more is expected from him by good critics.

- HERBERT HEATON.—Head of the Economics Department, Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario. Formerly Lecturer in Economics, University of Adelaide, South Australia.
- LOUISE MOREY BOWMAN.—Of Montreal. A Canadian poetess, who has contributed much verse to Canadian and American magazines. She has published also two volumes of poems, entitled *Moonlight and Common Day* and *Dream Tapestries* which have won high praise.
- THE HON. BENJAMIN RUSSELL.—Formerly Justice of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia. Retired recently from judicial duty. In the article here published he has brought together some recollections of his early days, when he reported law cases tried before judges of the bench to which he was afterwards appointed.
