

With deep regret, the *Dalhousie Review* records two deaths that occurred as this issue was going to press.

Charles Frederick Fraser, who died on November 28, 1961, was Editor of the "Review" in 1952-1953. He resigned on retiring from his position as Director of the Dalhousie University Institute of Public Affairs. Mr. Fraser had been Professor of Law at Northeastern University, Managing Editor of the *Halifax Chronicle*, and Canadian Representative on UNESCO. At the time of his death, he was Economic Consultant to the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Dr. Lorne Pierce, who died on November 27, 1961, was a member of the Editorial Advisory Board from 1952 to 1961. As the recognized dean of Canadian publishers, he exercised a unique influence on Canadian literature and education. Among his many honours and distinctions was an honorary degree of Doctor of Laws conferred by Dalhousie University in May, 1960.
