Articles and works of fiction should not normally exceed 5000 words while the preferred length of poems is less than forty lines. Material should be double-spaced except for quoted matter. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively and typed together at the end of the article. Articles on floppy disk, particularly those using IBM and IBM-compatible systems with Word-perfect, are preferred. Other systems are often acceptable. Material submitted on diskette should be accompanied by hardcopy. Return of diskettes and manuscripts cannot be expected unless accompanied by a self-addressed envelope and return postage in Canadian stamps or International Reply Coupons.
