CALL FOR PAPERS

Members and friends of the Society of Architectural Historians are invited to submit abstracts (maximum length 250 words/one page) **before 10 November 1996** for the session listed below. Abstracts should be sent directly to the chairpersons of the session (see below) or, for open sessions, to the SAH office in Chicago. The content of the proposed paper should not have been previously published and should not have been previously presented to any but a small or local audience. In the abstract, which will be held in confidence, the author should succinctly state the problem and summarize the argument that will be presented in the paper. Applicants should include home and work addresses, telephone and fax numbers, and institutional or firm affiliation, if any. Abstracts of accepted papers will be prepared for distribution at the meeting. The author must prepare and send a finished copy of the accepted paper to the session chairperson by 15 March 1997. Applicants may submit only one abstract for consideration for the 1997 meeting; multiple submissions by one person to different sessions or to the same session will render those submissions invalid. No one may be involved with more than one session, either as leader or as speaker.

Reshaping the Canadian City: The Impact of American Modernism to 1967

While modern architecture in Europe and the United States developed through an exchange of ideas between the two, the arrival and subsequent establishment of International modernism in Canada was largely filtered through the American example. Canadian business practices, established in the 19th century, encouraged this situation of architectural hegemony: American rather than Canadian architects were favoured for the most important commissions. Nowhere was the paradigm of American influence more apparent than in the context of the post-Second World War Canadian city. This session will consider the role of American modernism on the development of the Canadian metropolis, focusing on how American models were received and interpreted by Canadian architects. While the direct impact of Canadian projects by American-based architects (such as Mies van der Rohe and I.M. Pei) is one avenue of consideration, we also encourage writers to examine how these projects may have led to a transmission of ideas through the principal/associate relationship of American architects and their Canadian collaborators. The influence of American planning theories on the reshaping of the Canadian city and the development of the suburb is another potential area of investigation. Just as we solicit papers that examine the flowering of American modernism in Canada, to encourage a line of development we also invite papers exploring the earlier influence of modern American architectural and planning models in the 1920s and 1930s, and examinations of critical shifts in Canadian architecture around the time of Expo '67. We are also interested in proposals that consider the place of education in the importation of modernism, as seen through the return of Canadian students from American schools such as IIT, MIT, and the GSD at Harvard.
