TWO NEW ARCHITECTURAL ARCHIVES

Two new architectural research facilities were opened this past year. On 29 October 1993 the Netherlands Architecture Institute was opened in Rotterdam. The Institute holds the archives of a large number of Dutch architects active between 1880 and 1940, including Cuypers, Berlage, De Bazel, De Klerk, Dudok, Duiker, Rietveld, Van Eesteren, and Berghoef. In the next few years the Institute intends to concentrate on the post-war erathree-quarters of the buildings in the Netherlands were constructed after 1945. And on 7 November 1993, the Heinz Architectural Center opened its doors in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Part of the Carnegie Museum of Art, the Heinz Center collects architectural drawings and related materials, and mounts public exhibitions. While the Center's area of focus is Pittsburgh and western Pennsylvania, its holdings include material by Richard Neutra, Robert Adam, Sir John Soane, H.H. Richardson, Eugène-Emmanuel Viollet-le-Duc, Sir Edwin Lutyens, Frank Lloyd Wright, and Paul Rudolph.


ARCHITECTS IN THE 1901 CANADIAN CENSUS

The contents of the fourth decennial census of Canada were released to researchers in January 1993. This census, taken on 31 March 1901, was the first to record the exact birthdate of every person enumerated, and the year of immigration for those not born in Canada. Also recorded, as in past censuses, were the place of birth (province or country), age, religion, etc. The birthdates and immigration years recorded in this census may be of interest to those doing biographical research on architects, builders, and other persons responsible for Canada's built environment. The birthdates and immigration years, while not without errors, appear to have been recorded with a reasonable degree of accuracy; one genealogist conservatively estimated about 70% accuracy for birthdates.

Entries for those who listed their occupation as "architect" in 1901 have been transcribed by Gordon Fulton and Dana Johnson for the communities of Vancouver, Victoria, New Westminster, Nelson, Nanaimo, Calgary, Edmonton, Regina, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Indian Head, Winnipeg, Brandon, Sault Ste. Marie, Fort William, Port Arthur, Kenora (Rat Portage), Windsor (Walkerville, Sandwich, Sandwich East, Windsor East, Ojibway), Blenheim, Guelph, Chatham, Amherstburg, Goderich, Hull, Sherbrooke, Trois-Rivières, Lennoxville, Glace Bay, Sydney, North Sydney, and Moncton. CLICK ONCE FOR THE PARTHENON

New York (AP)—A new CD-ROM called The Great Buildings Collection offers the opportunity to take computer-guided walking tours of the world's most famous structures. Designed as the first interactive electronic architecture encyclopedia, Great Buildings uses a \$300 CD-ROM disk and high-end Macintosh computers to simulate full-colour versions of everything from the World Trade Center in New York to the Parthenon in Greece. Any viewing perspective can be chosen, and live video pictures are also available. Users can browse 600 samples from the Bronze Age through the present, according to building type, construction type, geographical region, historical era or name of architect. Designer Kevin Matthews, an architecture professor at the University of Oregon, said the software was four years in the making and will be on the market soon.
