Manitoba Architecture Slide Show

John Lehr and Neil Einarson have recently completed a long standing project which involved the preparation of a twenty slide package aimed at representing the significant architectural heritage of Manitoba. The Manitoba Architecture Slide Show was compiled with the assistance of the Historic Resources Branch, Manitoba Culture, Heritage and Recreation.

Included with 18 colour and 2 black and white slides is an outline of the historical significance of each edifice. Subjects include: St. Peter's Anglican Church (1853-4) Sod Huts (1883), Bank of Montreal (1910), Morden Courthouse (1904) Winnipeg Art Gallery (1970-2) and the Royal Canadian Mint (1976).

An Inventory of the Historical Monuments in the County of Northampton: Volume VI, Architectural Monuments in North Northamptonshire, Royal Commission on Historical Monuments, Northamptonshire VI, London HMSO 1984. Cost £45, 176 pages.

This book comprises an inventory of buildings mostly pre-1800. An introduction, called a Sectional Preface, comprises a topographical and historical introduction to this area of the country and an architectural analysis of the buildings. Anyone familiar with earlier volumes published by RCHM(E) will find that this gives a far better analytical approach to the architecture of the area than previously. It is illustrated with 223 text figures and 128 plates.
