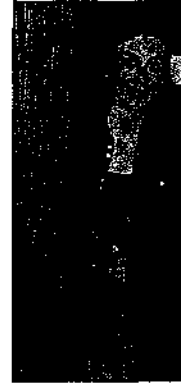


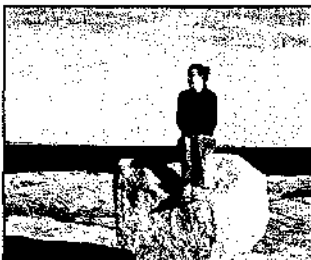
Author Biographies
